Charter Oak Communities continues to closely monitor the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Governor Lamont has issued a directive to "Stay Safe, Stay Home". Although our offices remain closed to the public, our staff is committed to providing the same level of service you have come to expect, remotely. Our property management team is available by phone and email, and drop boxes or mail slots have been installed at all offices.

We understand that these are challenging times for our community and we will continue to provide updates and guidance as information becomes available. If you would like to sign up for The State of Connecticut Emergency Notification System, please visit **www.ctalert.gov**. This service will provide updates via text message, phone, and email.

Please note that our cleaning vendor continues to clean high-touch areas such as elevator buttons, door knobs, and handrails frequently.

Our maintenance staff will respond to all emergency calls; however please continue to call all maintenance requests, (203) 977-1494, as routine calls will be logged to be completed at a later date. We are asking for your help in minimizing plumbing emergencies by being mindful of items you pour into your sinks and flush in your toilet. Please do not pour any grease or cooking oil into your sinks. Please do not flush wipes or paper towels down your toilet. Only toilet paper should be flushed; all other items should be disposed of in the trash. We appreciate your cooperation and participation in keeping our residents and staff safe.

RENT REBATE

The Connecticut Rent Rebate Program runs from April 1-October 1. The Connecticut Rent Rebate Program is for renters aged 65 + by 12/31/2019 who are single or married. Disabled individuals are also eligible. Applicants must have proof of their income for 2019 and proof of all rental expenses (rent, gas, electric, sewer bills) for 2019. Toni Khan (203)-977-4747 handles the rent rebate program. At this time due to the Covid-19 virus epidemic no in person or mail in applications are being taken. HEALTH RESOURCES/ COVID -19 TESTING

- 1. Contact your Primary Care Provider (PCP) by telephone to obtain evaluation and prescription, if warranted, for test.
- 2. If you don't have a PCP, but do have health insurance, contact your health insurance provider to obtain a name or names of approved PCP(s) to contact.
- 3. If you don't have either a PCP or health insurance, you may contact one of the following organizations:
 - a. Optimus Health Care at 203-327-5111.
 - b. Community Health Center (CHC) of Stamford at Fifth Street at 203-323-8160.
 - c. <u>Americares</u> at 203-658-9500. Americares is providing patient care via telephone to current patients only (no new patients).
 - d. <u>Family Centers Health</u> Care at 203-717-1760 to establish care. Their physical location is in Greenwich. They aren't currently accepting walk ins.

IMPORTANT CORONAVIRUS UPDATE AND OPERATIONAL CHANGES

Dear COC Residents,

As we continue to monitor the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, Charter Oak Communities (COC) is frequently evaluating our operations and how they impact the safety and well-being of our residents and employees.

In our efforts to keep you safe and stop the spread of COVID-19, the following safety measures have been implemented effective immediately:

- COC staff will only respond to emergency maintenance calls. All routine work order calls will
 continue to be logged through our call center and will be addressed at a date to be determined.
 Please do not place multiple calls for the same repair issue.
- The maintenance call center staff will ask questions pertaining to the health and travel history of household members.
- o If you do have an emergency, maintenance staff will enter your apartment to make repairs wearing protective equipment. Please do not be alarmed; this equipment serves to protect residents and staff alike.
- o If maintenance staff is working in your apartment, you will be required to maintain a distance of 6 feet. This distance is referred to "Social Distancing" which is highly recommended by the Centers for Disease Controls and Prevention (CDC) to control the spread of the virus.
- o All community rooms and playgrounds will be closed until further notice.
- o Limit visitors to urgent and emergency matters only.

As a reminder, our offices remain closed; however employees will continue to provide services and are available by telephone and email. Please also note that a drop box or mail slot has been installed at properties. Please place all documents you need to submit to your property manager in the drop box. Be sure to mark all documents clearly with your name and address. Note that payments should **not** be placed in the drop box.

Please do not hesitate to contact the Property Management Office or your Resident Service Coordinator with any questions or concerns.

We appreciate your cooperation as we take these important and proactive steps to keep our communities safe.
